Christmas Message from Dean John

I've found myself reflecting this year on the peculiar paradox of the Prince of Peace being born into such a crucible of conflict. On Sunday December 7th, we welcomed our most recent CCN partner, **Embrace the Middle East** (right) in a beautiful Cathedral Evensong service. The contrast between church and Cathedral Christmas services and the reality of life in the middle east, both 2000 years ago and today, has often been noticed – but for some reason this year it has struck me with renewed force, not as something to be avoided, but embraced, as we speak with honesty about the world, and hope about the gospel of peace.

The Coventry story is one of God's love in Jesus being made known precisely in the midst of the rubble of conflict. It's actually a very Christmas story – and of course Provost Howard's repudiation of 'all thoughts of revenge' was initially made on Christmas Day. Our crosses of nails speak of God's love and hope discovered in that crucible of conflict – that's where God's presence is most powerfully revealed. As the text in the entrance of the Cathedral says, "To the glory of God this Cathedral burned November 14 1940". The light of God's love shines brightest in the dark, and some things are quite dark at the moment.





As many of you will know, I will be retiring from this role at the Cathedral in May 2026. It's a bittersweet move to be making, as I will be stepping away from so much that I have loved to be part of. During the last thirteen years, we have seen the CCN and ICONS together almost double in number, and I have personally had the privilege of taking crosses of nails to dozens of new partners in some extraordinary places (pictured left: with Trinity Cathedral, Sacramento, which was welcomed with a Cross of Nails in November). As the world continues to fracture, the work of the CCN offers a way for people to say that reconciliation is the way forward, that peace and justice can go hand in hand, that we can find the strength to reach across divisions to forge a better future. I'm always thrilled to see new communities place a cross at their heart, as a signpost to a way of following Jesus which is including rather than excluding of difference.

I hope very much to stay in touch with many of you – as we know, Coventry has a way of getting under your skin! If you're able to join us for one of several farewell events in May (Saturday 9th for a Cathedral party in the evening, Sunday 17th for morning or evening services, with cake from our CCN friends from the Mothers' Union after evensong) we would love to see you. In the meantime, may you know Christ's presence with you over these coming days, wherever you are, and God's calling upon you as a peacemaker for the New Year.
