The Welcome and Introduction

*The Right Reverend Sophie Jelley, Bishop of Coventry, invites everyone to SIT.
Jo King, Warden of Readers, introduces the service.
The Bishop also welcomes all present and then continues:*

My sisters and brothers, through baptism, God welcomes us into the fellowship of the universal Church. The ministry of lay persons is to represent Christ and his Church; to bear witness to him wherever they may be; and, according to their gifts, to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world; and to take their place in the life, worship and governance of the Church.

We gather to celebrate lay ministry; to admit and license those called to the ministry of Reader.

We gather to recognize those who have completed the Learning Pathways in response to God's call to deeper service and discipleship and equipping for ministry.

We gather to celebrate the women and men nominated by their respective parishes/benefices in recognition for their faithful witness and ministry within their local faith community and their encouragement of the ministries of God's people, as the Spirit distributes gifts among us all.

All of this flows from our shared calling to live as people of reconciliation, rooted in God's grace and mercy.

The Coventry Litany of Reconciliation

The Reverend Nitano Muller, Canon for Worship and welcome leads the litany.

All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God.

The hatred which divides nation from nation, race from race, class from class,

Father, forgive.

The covetous desires of people and nations to possess what is not their own,

Father, forgive.

The greed which exploits the work of human hands and lays waste the earth,

Father, forgive.

Our envy of the welfare and happiness of others,

Father, forgive.

Our indifference to the plight of the imprisoned, the homeless, the refugee,

The Liturgy of the Word

“Called”: About Reader Ministry

Readers are called to serve the Church of God and to work together with clergy and other licensed lay ministers. They are to lead public worship, to preach and teach the Word of God, to assist at the Eucharist and to share in pastoral and evangelistic work. As authorized lay ministers, they are to encourage the ministries of God's people, as the Spirit distributes gifts among us all. They are called to help the whole Church to participate in God's mission to the world.

The Presentation of the Candidates for Admission

The congregation SITS. The candidates for admission remain STANDING and Anthony Rich, Debbie Rumsby and Geoff Wiggin are presented to the Bishop by the Warden of Readers, who says,

Bishop Sophie,
I present Anthony, Debbie and Geoff to be admitted to the
office of Reader:

The Bishop asks these questions, to which the Warden and the Secretary of Readers respond:

Have Anthony, Debbie and Geoff made the Declaration of Assent, and thereby affirmed and declared their belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness?

They have.

Have they also made the declaration of obedience to the Bishop and the declaration which must be made before a Reader is licensed?

They have.

Are they people of Christian character, well versed in the Holy Scriptures and in the doctrines of our faith?

They are.

Have they been sufficiently prepared for the duties of this office?

They have.

The Questions

The Bishop says to the candidates:

In order that we may be satisfied that you are ready to begin the ministry of a Reader, you must now answer the questions we put to you.

Do you believe that God is calling you to this ministry?

I do so believe.

Will you be faithful in leading the people of God in worship, and in preaching the Word to them?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you be diligent in prayer, in reading Holy Scripture, and in all studies that will deepen your faith and fit you to bear witness to the truth of the gospel?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you endeavour to fashion your life according to the way of Christ?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you promote unity, peace and love in the Church and in the world, and especially among those whom you serve?

By the grace of God, I will.

Will you work closely with your colleagues in ministry and encourage the gifts of others?

By the grace of God, I will.

The candidates turn to face the congregation, and the Bishop says,

Sisters and brothers, Anthony, Debbie and Geoff have been chosen for the office of Reader. Will you uphold and encourage them in their ministry?

All: We will.

Will you continue to pray for them?

All: We will.

The Bishop invites the clergy of the new Readers' parishes to come forward and asks:

Will you work closely with your new Readers and encourage them to use their gifts and develop their ministry?

I will.

Will you commend them to the people amongst whom they will minister?

I will.

The Admission

The candidates stand before the Bishop, who admits each them to the office of Reader by the delivery of a copy of the Bible in accordance with Canon E5, with these words:

I admit you as a Reader in the Church of God,
in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

*The new Readers are vested with a blue preaching scarf by their Incumbents.
The Bishop blesses them in these words:*

May the Lord give you
wisdom, courage, strength and love to do his will,
and the blessing of God almighty,
the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit,
rest upon you, and on your work done in his name,
now and always. **Amen**

*The new Readers turn to face the congregation and are greeted with
applause.*

The Re-Licensing of Readers

*The Warden presents those who are renewing their licence or Permission to
Officiate in the Diocese, who stand as their name is read out.*

Bishop Sophie, I present to you those to be relicensed as
Readers in this Diocese:

The Warden then reads their names. The Warden then says,

Those who are renewing their Permission to Officiate in the
Diocese:

The Warden then reads their names.

*When all those to be relicensed are standing, the Bishop confirms their
ministry:*

Receive authority to exercise the office of Reader in this
Diocese.

May the Lord be with you in all your work and ministry
from this day onwards.

As a Diocese, we celebrate all that lay people give to the life of the church and to their community. We give thanks to God for the children, women and men who respond to God’s call and generously offer their skills, gifts and ministries, acknowledging their immense contributions to the building up of God’s Kingdom and their faithful witness and work among us.

Lay leaders and volunteers are invited to stand when an area of ministry or service that they are involved in is mentioned by the Reverend Rob Harrison, Director of Ministry & Leadership.

The nominated volunteers are called forward to stand before the Bishop, who offers a word of appreciation and encouragement to them

An organ fanfare is sounded as nominated volunteers, licensed lay ministers and those who have completed Pathways step forward and are applauded.

The Renewal of Commitment

The Bishop invites the congregation to stand.

My sisters and brothers, in the name of the Church

READERS IN COVENTRY



What is a Reader? Readers are theologically trained and licensed by the Bishop, and are normally based in a parish church, leading services and preaching.

What else do Readers do? Readers undertake a wide range of tasks. These include chaplaincy; community involvement including in schools and food banks; leading home groups; prayer co-ordination; church support via creative and administrative tasks and funeral ministry including interment of ashes.
